

Come and Worship

Come, thou long expected Jesus, born to set thy people free; from our fears and sins release us, let us find our rest in thee. Israel's strength and consolation, hope of all the earth thou art; dear desire of every nation, joy of every longing heart.

December is when the Church Year begins with the season of Advent, the season of hope. The word "advent" comes from Latin and refers to the coming of Christ in history, in our hearts, and in the future.

The hope for God's Anointed One – the Christ, which is an English version of the Greek word, or the Messiah, the English version of the Hebrew word – that hope was expressed by prophets in Israel's ancient history. God's Anointed One would put Israel right, which is to say return the governance of Israel to the intentions of God made known through the Torah of Moses. God's Anointed would also set human hearts right, as Malachi says at the end of the last book in the Old Testament: "He will turn the hearts of parents to their children and the hearts of children to their parents."

I've missed Isaiah. The songs of Isaiah express much of the hope for the Messiah in powerful and poignant images. This month, we'll open Isaiah's poetry to enrich our Advent so that we can prepare our hearts and minds and homes for the celebration of the birth of Jesus the Christ.



The First Sunday in Advent focuses on God the Potter from Isaiah 64. We are God's clay, molded, shaped, formed, and fired. In a world all about the self-made person, it's easy to forget how God oversees our lives.

"Comfort, comfort my people!" God tells Isaiah in the 40th chapter on the Second Sunday of Advent. It's a moment of great despair for Israel, who has been taken into exile and fears her life as a nation and a people, indeed as individuals, may be over. So the prophet comforts in the face of calamity when all the moorings of meaning have been destroyed.

On the Third Sunday in Advent, we hear the mission that Jesus undertook to define his ministry. "The spirit of the Lord GOD is upon me, because the LORD has anointed me; he has sent me to bring good news to the oppressed, to bind up the brokenhearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives, and release to the prisoners; to proclaim the year of the LORD's favor, and the day of vengeance of our God; to comfort all who mourn." Isaiah 61:1-2 NRSVA

The Fourth Sunday in Advent turns toward the immediate expectation of Christmas Eve, and this year it is immediate, as they both are on Sunday. So, the parish will have one combined Sunday morning Advent service at 10 AM at St Paul, and then separate Christmas Eve services: 7 pm at Faith and 10:30 pm at St. Paul. Our prophetic text will come from 2 Samuel, from which the story of Jesus' birth draws much imagery. There, the prophet Nathan tells king David that God has provided Israel's future: "Your house and your kingdom shall be made sure forever before me; your throne shall be established forever."

Also throughout Advent, we will have our Wednesday evening suppers and prayer service. Our readings will be drawn from Malachi according to the daily lectionary. We'll look at scriptures around reconciliation and what it means to be a Reconciled in Christ congregation. We'll alternate between St. Paul, Faith, and St. Paul according to our continuous pattern of rotation. See the schedule elsewhere in the Epistle.

One last thing to look for: last Christmas Eve we switched our service time to 10:30 AM at St. Paul to see if it would attract and encourage more households by avoiding the noon hour. A poll will be published to see whether the congregation wants to keep the 10:30 AM worship time or return to 11:00 AM. Look for it and take it, so the Council can choose wisely!

Greetings in Christ Jesus! I would like to invite you to join us at Faith Lutheran Church (12703 N. Florida Avenue, Tampa 33612), for a Bible study on Christian-Muslim relations, led by Gabriel Morgan. The purpose of our study will be to offer an introduction to Islam and to deepen our faith in Jesus Christ. We will explore common ground and seek ways of engaging our Muslim neighbors in peace and justice, and we will also explore areas of difference and gain clarity about our own faith through the study of God's Word. In order to best facilitate this process, we will use the "Talking Points" published by the Center of Christian-Muslim Engagement for Peace and Justice at the Lutheran School of Theology at Chicago.
