FROM THE PASTOR

Greetings of the risen Christ to the Lutheran Urban Parish of Tampa!

What a blessing and an honor it has been to lead our parish through Holy Week for the first time as the new pastor. I have to say, I was initially feeling intimidated to preach on Easter morning, thinking about all those potential visitors. But after that long Vigil, Easter felt like a walk in the park! Thanks to everyone who showed up for our Maundy-Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter Vigil services. Once again, I want to give a hearty welcome to our new members, whom we received at the Easter Vigil this year: Josie Bachowski, Julie Ward, and Don Kiser. Thank you for becoming a part of our life together in the body of Christ!

I would also like to say how truly grateful I am for the extremely generous gifts given at my ordination. I really did not expect that! I received new stoles and chasubles, an espresso maker, new socks, and probably a dozen gift cards! Thank you so much!

I'd like to take the opportunity in this May epistle to brief the parish on some of our upcoming activities for ordinary time after Easter.

First, I want to say that I am excited to start a series of new studies for the parish. It is written, "One does not live by bread alone, but by every word that comes from the mouth of God" (Deut. 8:3; Matt. 4:4). What good news that God feeds us with a Word of mercy! It is essential for a vital church to be in God's Word. We are going to establish a regular weekly study together. There will be one scheduled meeting time with varying content. Most of these sessions will be Bible studies, maybe 70-80%. However, there won't be a bunch of worksheets with strange questions on them to "answer." We will use a practice of reading, discussing, and re-reading to discover what God's written Word says to us today. We will reflect together about Christ's call for us, as well as about our personal spiritual needs and daily life. The other 20% of these sessions will be on special topics, from 4-6 weeks at a time, then returning to regularly scheduled Bible study. For example, some of these special topics might include: ancient church and the Nicene Creed, Reformation, religious pluralism, social justice, science and religion, immigration, and worship and liturgy. The first of these studies will be on James Cone, who was one of my professors at Union Seminary and who was the founder of black liberation theology. These topics will be integrated with scripture readings as well.

Secondly, work on the nursery at St Paul is ongoing. That space will soon function as a multi-purpose classroom without losing its capacity to serve as a nursery if needed. Once the space is finished, we will start to reach out to other families in the area for tutoring. We will need volunteers. You don't have to have teaching or tutoring experience to be a volunteer. Sometimes we simply need people present.

Lastly, I am very excited and proud to share with the parish that we are self-sufficient in the Well ministry at the Good Samaritan. We now have our own key to Waters Avenue Church, and have the volunteers needed to staff it ourselves.

However, this does not mean we can just relax and go on auto-pilot! Poverty in the Tampa urban core is a deep and ongoing challenge. The need in the neighborhood around Faith is as great or greater than it is around St Paul. There are numerous poor and homeless individuals that come through the campus of Faith daily. Now Christ calls us to care for the poor where we are, for he says, "give to everyone who begs of you" (Lk 6:30). This is a simple call, though we may have our reasons for not wanting to do it. We may not think that is how we grow our ministry, or we may be uncomfortable interacting directly with the poor. Yet our wisdom and experience isn't what matters most. What matters most is what Christ says to us, and that simple call is often the difference between a vital ministry and being stuck in old habits with no fish in our nets.

In the Eblast, I spoke of how Christ gave his disciples a simple yet odd command: to throw their nets over the other side of the boat. They could have followed their own wisdom and experience, and said, "that's absurd; obviously, if there's no fish on this side, there aren't any on that side!" Yet they did what Christ said, and they were blessed with more fish than they could haul. Christ's powerful Word brought about a new reality, a bounty of fish that their experience told them was impossible.

We have the ability and we have the call from our Lord. It is time that we began planning to start a second Well ministry at the campus of Faith Lutheran. And this will also be a great way to connect the people of that neighborhood to the garden at Faith. Because of the schedule on which the Well receives food donations, it would have to be the second or fourth Saturday. I am confident we can replicate this powerful ministry, and I ask you to plug in and support it as you are able, either with additional food and clothing donations or with your time.

"Do not be afraid to ask if it is something you believe in." Desmond Tutu, as relayed by a member of HOPE This month, I wanted to ask for your participation in several events that St Paul supports.

The first is the fence clean up that Pastor Morgan spoke about in his sermon last week. There is a fence on the south border of Faith Lutheran Church that is overgrown with bushes and trees. Passersby can see our community garden but from the street, it is not clear if the garden is connected with the church and the ministry of Faith Lutheran. This Saturday, May 4th, we are assembling a group of volunteers to assist in clearing the fence line of bushes, plants, and trees that may be blocking the view from the street. While we are looking for individuals who have chain saws, power saws, or hand saws, the more people who volunteer to help, the faster the job will go and the sooner we get done. Starting time is tentatively set for 8:00 am in the Faith Lutheran Church parking lot.

The second item that could use a few more volunteers is our food distribution ministry at <u>The Well</u>. Every third Saturday of the month, volunteers meet at the <u>Waters Avenue Church</u>, 609 Waters Ave., at 8:30 am, load donated food, drink, and clothing, and then drive it to the Good Samaritan Inn, 3302 N. Florida Ave, where tables are set up, and the items are distributed free of charge to individuals living in the transitional housing located on the property. The residents are always appreciative of the gifts that we distribute there. I've done this for about one year and I find the experience very rewarding.

Finally, as Saint Paul's representative to the organization <u>Hillsborough Organization for Progress and Equality</u>, a.k.a. HOPE, I would like to invite all of our congregants, especially those who attended the Nehemiah Action on April 1st, to attend the Justice Ministry Celebration – Monday, May 13, 2018, 6:30 pm – 8:30 pm at The Portico, 1001 N Florida Ave, Tampa, FL 33602.We will unite to share a potluck meal, enjoy music, get updates on issues, celebrate and build community. This year, HOPE was instrumental in convincing a majority of Hillsborough county board <u>members to establish a recurring fund of \$10 million for the purpose of building, preserving</u>, and rehabbing housing for low income individuals and families. We have members, both at Saint Paul and Faith that struggle with housing costs. This fund could help them and many others in need of affordable housing.

One of the functions of the event is to encourage individuals to invest in the organization so that it can continue its mission. The Justice Ministry Celebration seeks individuals to invest \$200 or more for the ongoing efforts by HOPE. I believe in the organization and I've pledged \$250 as an investment in HOPE and I encourage those who can afford it to invest as well. HOPE will of course accept investments of any amount. Possessed by Possessions?

Here are a couple things Jesus says relating to what we have or need. The commentaries raise some good issues to mull over. Having less makes it easier to focus on what is really important.

Luke 6:30 – Jesus said, "Give to everyone who begs from you; and if anyone takes away your goods, do not ask for them again."

What's your relationship with money? Most of us have been acculturated to hold onto our worldly possessions with an iron grip. Do you? Jesus suggests a way of life where we are not attached to our possessions, and where we feel free to allow our money and the things we own slip through our fingers. If you open your fingers and let your possessions go, what Godly treasures could you grasp?

Mark 6:8, 9 – Jesus ordered them to take nothing for their journey except a staff; no bread, no bag, no money in their belts; but to wear sandals and not to put on two tunics.

What do you need for your journey in life? Most of us think we need far more than we actually do, and our lives become weighed down with our possessions. When Jesus sends out the disciples with very little, he reminds us that we, too, need very little in life. What could <u>you</u> do without?

From Pastor Morgan



I went to the Mission Developer Training in Seattle, *Church Planting in*

Post-Christian Soil, and the book makes some suggestions about practices that we could adopt as a parish. One of those suggested practices is to go on "prayer walks" around our neighborhoods. The idea is not that we would be knocking on doors and trying to convert people. Instead, the idea is simply to walk in our neighborhoods, making ourselves present in a prayerful way, and reflecting prayerfully on what we see and on what the neighborhood needs. In this case, the interruptions really are the ministry. Sometimes we might be asked to pray for people as well, but the heart of that practice is simply being present in the neighborhood, and open to the people we encounter. We will have prayer walks once a month for each congregation the first Thursday (May 2) of the month for Faith, and the second Thursday (May 9) of the month for St Paul. I will be present for every walk. We will start at about 4:00 pm and walk different areas of our neighborhoods for about an hour. If this sounds interesting to you, then come join me for our prayer walks.
